## **GHANA REUNION NEWSLETTER**

I am writing to you again partly about the proposed visit to Ghana next year, and partly to let you know that we have been able to arrange another Reunion Lunch along the lines of the successful event held in June last year.

First, details about the lunch: it will take place at John Adams Hall (Institute of Education), Endsleigh Street, WC1 (the same venue as last year) on Thursday 15 June.
