The main purpose of this letter is to tell you about the plans for the visit to Ghana next year and issue a "last call" to any of you who would like to join it. The visit will take place between 26 March & 6 April at an overall cost of approx £1100/1200, depending on the internal trips undertaken; there will be optional visits to the Volta Dam/Lake and Ho with overnight stay; and visits to either Cape Coast or Kumasi & Tamale, involving 4/5 nights stay. We are negotiating with the Ghana Tourist Board about the charges in State hotels (eg Ambassador); if successful, costs could be reduced by approx £150. While staying in Accra and the other centres there will be opportunities to see old friends and make local visits to old haunts; for those interested there will be some school visits and meetings with officials about the objectives of Ghana School Aid - the Secretary (Minister) for Education has sent a welcoming message via Sam Essah whom some of us know.
